



Intergenerational Playgroup @ All Saints

The Anglican Parish of Hunters Hill is establishing an Intergenerational Playgroup that will operate in Term 3 2022 from 10am to 11:30am on Friday mornings (22nd July to 23rd September) at All Saints' Church Hall at 2 Ambrose Street, Hunters Hill.

The group is limited to ten children and ten senior participants. Attendance is by application only (see over), and each applicant is assessed.

The following information may help you in determining if you would like to apply:

- Children need to be between 4 and 6 years of age. They need to be able to communicate with adults, have independence skills that will allow them to be left with other carers and be able to independently toilet themselves.
- Adults need to have independent mobility, be able to perform activities of daily living and communicate and interact.
- For children, a parent/carer needs to remain on site (or at the coffee shop across the road) in case they are needed (contacted by phone). They do not remain in the room however. Tea and coffee will be available, and a space to work or meet other parents.
- Participants need to commit to all ten weeks. We know there will be times when someone may be sick, but we do ask that the intention is to commit to all ten weeks. The programme however works by forming relationships and bonds over the ten weeks.
- Lily Thio is engaged in the Parish as our Children's Worker and is coordinating this program. Lily has skills and expertise in working with children and older persons that she will be utilising within this programme.
- The other people on site who will be conducting the programme are all members of our Parish and have completed Safe Ministry Training, a Working with Children Check, a Safe Ministry Check and a Police Check.
- The programme includes group activities such as story, music, craft and puzzles. There is also time for sharing together and food. Activities may occur in the church hall or outside in the church grounds (weather permitting).
- The programme is run by our Parish, and to ensure we are upfront, it will include aspects of our faith such as stories and songs that may connect to faith, and we will say grace before we eat.
- There is no cost to the programme, other than your time. We see this as a gift and as an important way of addressing some of the issues we see in our community in terms of isolation and disconnection.

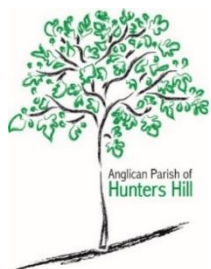
